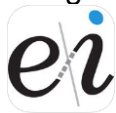
To encourage systemic changes:

- Inform your state representatives that you support Safe Harbor laws and the ability to expunge criminal records for victims
- Call your U.S. senators & congresspersons encouraging them to reauthorize & better fund the Trafficking Victims Protection Act
- Inform the store manager where you shop that you buy fair trade products

Ban Human Trafficking – Learn about trafficking by choosing your avatar and make choices that keep you safe or lead to you becoming a trafficked person – great for all ages 10 & up. Sponsored by the European Union.



ei Traffickcam – Help build a data base to assist law enforcement in recognition of hotel rooms, leading to interception of people advertised online for sex from hotels. It takes 1 minute to open app, snap 4 pictures of your hotel room and submit hotel name and room number.



Ethical Barcode: Scan the barcode of a potential product and trace the 'slavery footprint'.
